

## **Funeral**

When a person passes away, our church family shares in your grief. The funeral service gives you a voice to share your thoughts, thank God for your loved one, and entrust them into the kingdom of God. We trust God's promises in baptism that we are claimed by Christ forever, and we rest in the sure hope of the resurrection. The congregation gathers to remember the person's life, honor Christ as King, and together we move forward. We are marked with Christ forever.

## **Death**

For your care and to help with planning services, please contact the church office (624-4442) immediately upon the death of a member of the congregation. No plans for the funeral should be made apart from consultation with the pastor and appropriate parish staff. It is a good idea to plan the funeral liturgy well before the death to avoid planning during the time of grieving.

## **Burial**

Military honors and fraternal tributes and rites are to be kept separate from the funeral and committal services of the church.

## **Gathering**

When we come together for a funeral service, we remember and celebrate the life we all receive through Jesus' life, death and resurrection.

## Additional Thoughts

1. Family members or friends are invited to speak at the prayer service. In preparation, we ask that they write down what they will say ahead of time, so that they can be sure to share those stories and ideas.
2. As a general policy, we do not use recorded music in worship. If you would like to play a piece of music that was special to your loved one, the prayer or visitation service or reception following the service, are good places to include these types of music.
3. Solos are nice additions to the worship service. It is good to include at least two hymns for the congregation to sing. Joining our voices in song, we share our grief and sorrow by lifting up our voices in prayer, praise and honor for the one who has gone before us, to this dwelling place that God has prepared for us. We proclaim the Good News.

4. It is appropriate to celebrate the Holy Communion through the Lord's Supper at the funeral worship service.
  
5. Flowers are a wonderful expression of people's love and care for the family of the deceased. There are many alternatives to share and remember people through lasting gifts to the church. Memorial gifts may be made to the Trinity Lutheran Church Special Revenue Fund; Roof Fund; as well as to individual ministries within the church.

Other Memorials: The Vermillion Community Food Pantry, located at 9 Court Street, is also a place to share memorial gifts.
